About Oakland Early College

Oakland Early College (OEC) is a “hybrid” school that fuses high school with college. Students at OEC attend school on Oakland Community College’s Orchard Ridge campus, and engage in an exciting college-preparatory curriculum taught by teachers from the award-winning West Bloomfield School District. Dual enrollment is a central component of every student’s educational experience, with students participating in an integrated sequence of high school and college courses.

OEC students graduate with their high school diplomas and 30 or more college credits towards their undergraduate degree. Many will earn an Associate Degree from Oakland Community College.

OEC is a public early college high school. There is no cost to students or their families for attending Oakland Early College. Tuition, most fees, and most textbook costs are paid for by the school.
